The event was a "Close the Border" rally after the Democrat-run Legislature refused to prioritize homeless veterans and instead voted to house and feed illegal immigrants rather than those who fought for this country. Needless to say, this was dominated by people who want to Make America Great Again.

Hundreds of people showed up for the rally in the Democratic stronghold, which shows just how much Americans oppose Joe Biden's and Democrats' open border policy of letting 8 million unvetted foreign nationals stream across the border, then ship them all around the country.

Remember that three unexcused absences results in being removed from the REC, and the cutoff time to request an excused absence is 8 hours prior to the meeting start time.

Vote By Mail

Florida law now requires new mail-in ballot request each cycle.

Mail-in voting is the law and we cannot cede this ground to the Democrats. So a few things to remember:

- Sarasota County Republicans frequently beat Democrats in mail-in voting, along with early voting and day of voting, in past election cycles.
- Since that time, the Florida Legislature and Governor DeSantis have further tightened our election laws every session.
- Requesting a mail-in ballots simply gives you the option to vote by mail. You can still vote in person until and including election day by dropping off your ballot. But if a hurricane hits, and it nearly did in 2022, then a mail-in ballot allows you do to that ahead of the hurricane. There is no downside to requesting one.
